The 7 Day War

The Story of Lydia Agayong

The radical Muslims in the town had planned an uprising, hoping to make Plateau State a Muslim state and force Sharia law upon all the citizens.

Terror gripped Lydia Agayong as she walked out of the pharmacy on Friday, September 7. Lydia had purchased some supplies for the small bush clinic in Mai Farin Moto Dong, a remote village near Jos, Nigeria. Unknown to her or any of the other Christians in Jos, the radical Muslims in the town had planned an uprising, hoping to make Plateau State a Muslim state and force Sharia law upon

Christians came to her rescue. It was at that point that the Muslims began using the guns they had secretly stockpiled for the occasion.

As Lydia left the pharmacy she saw people being killed before her eyes and thought that surely her life would end that day. Masses of people were running here and there and there was the added danger of being trampled to death if she tripped and fell. She dropped everything that she had purchased and began running. On every street there was fighting and she finally decided to attempt to get to the nearest SDA church. As she ran she saw a taxi driver beckoning her to enter his taxi. In her confusion she feared that it was a trap, but the driver, through hand signals, pled with her to get into his car. He had difficulty finding a route out of the war zone, but ultimately dropped her at the road leading to Dong Village. Not one word had been spoken by either Lydia or the driver during the ride and no fare was collected.

Again Lydia began to run in the direction of the village, and again a taxi driver, this time a Muslim, indicated that she should get into his car. The

all the citizens.

When the Muslims gave their call to prayer at 2 p.m. on that fateful Friday, no one gave it a second thought, especially with Friday being their day of worship. When they claimed that a Nigerian woman walked through their prayer area and began to beat the woman, the

taxi driver dropped Lydia at exactly the spot where she could get a motorcycle directly to Dong village, and safety. Again, she and the driver had not spoken a word to each other and the driver collected no fare. Angels? Very likely! "The angel of the Lord encampeth round about them that fear him and

Wellness Center Matures Lifestyle Program

As Hartland Wellness Center has explored more assertive ways to use natural medicine, the Lord has truly blessed with an excellent bevy of physicians and tremendous results over this past year. Hartland Wellness Center's approach is centered on the "Eight Laws of Health," and is now seeking to optimize its effect on our guests.

Therapies: Our therapy Department is changing with the addition of three new staff (Tony & Nora Ricono and Guido Erne), we have greatly strengthened our hydrotherapy program. Hydro/massage therapy has increased from three times a week, to a minimum of five times (and more if needed), thus both greatly improving results and increasing health guest satisfaction.

Exercise: In order to maximize the benefits of exercise and to establish the correct individualized program during the health session and afterwards, Tony Ricono has added new exercise and monitoring

equipment. A proper exercise program greatly increases the chances of reversing heart disease, diabetes and a host of other diseases. Guests now have more effective ways of monitoring their progress, as well as excellent exercise counseling.

Water: American people are very dehydrated. So, Hartland Wellness Center has also increased its attention on water drinking. In order to both assure proper hydration during treatment, and to develop new lifestyle habits, our staff encourage an aggressive water

drinking awareness program. Too often the only water that our guests consume when they arrive at Hartland is in their coffee or soft drinks. Nutrition: Due to the effects of the improper "American Diet," we have increased our use of

herbs, fresh juices, raw fruits and vegetables and cleansing. As we continue to monitor and fine-tune these under medical

supervision, we are seeing tremendous results in both lab results (which are checked regularly throughout the program) and in how our guests feel. The more we

study, the more we find that the "Standard American Diet" is truly the SAD diet.

Health Food Store: With our new in-house health food store, we can train our guests how to purchase food at home. Our staff show them what their new groceries will look like and teach them how to understand labels. With over 200 items, we can now also ship needed health food supplies that they (or anyone) are unable to acquire at home. GENERAL CONFERENCE'S THREATENING ARTICLE

Many have asked us the status of the not-too-thinly veiled threat of the General Conference against Hope International, Hartland Institute and Remnant Ministries, published in an article in the August 2000 Adventist Review. The Review article complained that these ministries do not follow "church authority" in conducting their ministries and appeared to threaten action against them if by the end of one year (presumably August 2001), the General Conference decided that they were still out of harmony with their authority. More than one year has transpired since the article was published, but there has been no official communication with us about any official or unofficial action.

The article was published after a series of meetings between representatives of the three ministries and an "ad hoc" committee of the General Conference stating that the three ministries have attempted to create a church within a church, because they hold camp meetings, publish competing periodicals, use their own baptismal vows, and accept tithe, etc. The three ministries earnestly objected to the characterization,

citing Bible, Spirit of Prophecy and historical evidence in support of their work in upholding the truth.

The three ministries have a deep love for the SDA Church and were greatly saddened by this action. However, they have a sincere love for souls and believe that God has given them an important work to do. Hartland's work in training young people as well as the other vital ministries, are greatly appreciated by many who can find few truth-centered alternative sources for these ministries. It is hoped that all leaders will exercise restraint in the future.

From what we can tell in private dialog with insiders at the General Conference as well as other sources, there is not likely to be any open and threatening action taken by the General Conference against these ministries. It may be that it is perceived as unwise. However, there may well be "behind the scenes" efforts to discredit and block their work. This would not be inconsistent with the history of self-supporting work in the Seventh-day Adventist Church, and at other periods in history, such as in the time of Christ.

The article complained that these ministries do not follow "church authority" in conducting their ministries.

A Lesson from the Pages of History

Lord Cobham Tried and Burned for Heresy

Sir John Oldcastle — Lord Cobham, was a champion of the Lollards, the colporteurs sent out by John Wycliffe. The times were dangerous for these early Protestants. Lord Cobham was born of a noble family and became a distinguished soldier and courtier in the time of Henry IV. His support for the Lollards was no secret. He had read the scriptures and was converted to the true principles of salvation as taught by Wycliffe. He would see to it that

copies of Wycliffe's writings were spread to other countries. He would stand near the Lollard preachers with sword in hand to defend them against violence and insults from the friars.

or decrees of the Pope (the head of the church) who is ".....the key bearer and porter of eternal life and death, bearing place and person, not of a mere man, but of true God here in earth." Apparently, he had forgotten that at the time there were actually 3 popes vying for dominance, cursing and anathematizing each other, and using sword and soldiers to support their claim to the throne. Which one was "true God here in earth?"

At his trial Lord Cobham defended the right to worship God according to the Bible. On one occasion he said; "Good people, lo, for breaking God's commandments these men never yet cursed me; but for their own laws and traditions most cruelly do." In 1417 he was hanged in chains and burned.

As for misrepresentations there were plenty, especially from church leaders; "Sir John Oldcastle..... papists charging him with treason against King Henry V and of heading an army of more than ten thousand men, though it wanted nine thousand, nine hundred and ninety nine thereof..." (Thomas Fuller, in his Worthies).

May there be more good men with characters like Lord Cobham.

The Secret to Solving a Big Tax Dilemma

Bill and Jean had a dilemma. When Faith Lyons called them Jean expressed her concern that she and Bill had dedicated a piece of property to the Lord, and needed to sell it. Her dilemma was that it was being taxed every year and no one was getting any benefit from it. Another concern was how to sell the property so that there wouldn't be so much capital gains taxes to pay. As they talked, Faith suggested that they donate the land to Hartland and let us sell it and use the proceeds in the Lord's work. Bill and Jean were excited about

this and transferred their property in January 2002.

Bill and Jean have done what many people have discovered is a great way to maximize the value of their property that they have dedicated to the Lord. They are donating the asset itself rather than

selling it and then donating the tax-reduced proceeds in cash. Taxes can often take a large part of an appreciated asset which means that the Lord's work would have less. The way to maximize the value of an appreciated asset is by donating either real or tangible property itself to God's work. God's work is able to use the full value of the property, untaxed, while the donor can take a tax deduction for the full value of the asset. The donor recovers at least some of the "profit" he would have made on the sale of the property through the tax deduction. Of course you should consult your accountant or attorney for a professional evaluation of such a gift. But it is a great idea for those in a similar situation to Bill and Jean.

This can be done with any appreciated asset, whether stocks, bonds, life insurance, antiques (including automobiles), or other tangible property. Best of all, you don't have the headache of selling it. The property doesn't even have to be in Virginia or on the East coast. It can be anywhere. It is an easy, stress free, fuss free method of disposing of unneeded property, while at the same time providing a substantial and lasting contribution to the cause of God.

Even At The Door

November 1951 I graduated from the Theological Normal Course (The Christian Education Course) at Avondale College. As a mere lad of eighteen, I was launched into the Lord's service. Well I recall the hopes and the fears that I had as I said goodbye to my father and boarded the train for my long journey to the far north coast of New South Wales, Australia to take up my first teaching appointment. I had a classroom of fourteen children. So remote was the school that there was no electricity or telephone. But there was a group of SDA banana growers who had accepted the Lord's instruction to take their families to the country, whose children I was to teach.

I started teaching in the pre-television age of Australia. Indeed, it would be more than four years before TV came and cast its hypnotic spell across Australia. Computers were not even considered in the minds of ordinary people. Air transportation was still largely limited to the rich and famous. It was to be another five years before I would own a car (the first car owned by any member of my family).

What a difference half a century makes. As I reflect I weep when I contemplate how irresponsible I have been in answering the call of my Savior. Sadly, that is true of most of my generation. We have failed the Lord. We have not turned to the Lord with our whole hearts fervently. We have not crucified self. We have not allowed Christ to wrench the world from our lives. And now we are seeing the beginning of the carnage that will transpire on this planet just prior to the coming of our Lord.

Dear brethren and sisters, I have committed myself to a deepening and fuller experience with my Lord. Nothing matters now other than our own salvation, that of our families and of the men and women on this planet. This must be the all consuming focus of our lives. I pray that you will join me in unwavering loyalty to Jesus and respond to the fullness of the call that He has placed upon our lives and service. May we not with even one word or action dishonor Him or lead people to turn from Jesus because we fail to represent His character.

I was told when I was young that time was short. But now I know that it is short! Christ is surely even at the door. There is only one event that is retarding the return of Jesus. We have not surrendered our lives fully to Him. "When the character of Christ is perfectly reproduced in His people, then He will come to claim them as His own." (COL 69) May this year be the year that we are ready to meet Jesus and may we have wonderful fruitage to present to Him. May God bless you all in 2002.
